
Vice President's Greeting Bill Blake-Vice President



The United States Curling Association will be hosting the 2015 National Wheelchair Curling Team Pre-Trials at the Four Seasons Curling Club, USA Curling's National Training Center, in Blaine, Minn., Aug. 20-23. This event will consist of individual skill shots as well as game play during the U.S. Wheelchair Curling National Bonspiel.

Throughout the Trials, participants will be assessed, interviewed and ranked by the Player Selection Committee regarding their curling abilities via skill shot analysis and game play as well as other qualities including on- and off-ice behavior, team dynamics and practice regimen.

The event schedule is as follows:

- Skills Testing 2:30 p.m. -6 p.m.
- Thursday Evening: Interviews

The panel will select the top seven athletes at the end of the competition. These seven athletes will then be invited to join the five members of the 2015 National Team to compete in the 2015-16 National Wheelchair Curling Team Trials. This event will be held in Wausau, Wis., Nov. 6-8, 2015. There, the selection panel will select the top five athletes at the end of the competition to represent Team USA at the 2016 World Wheelchair Curling Championship Feb. 21-28 in Lucerne, Switzerland.

The registration fee for the Pre-Trials, which includes the registration fee for the National Bonspiel, is \$75.

The deadline for registration is July 20, 2015. To register, go to https://usacurling.wufoo.com/forms/mnqfk0o0cvwhqf/.

The first ever U.S. Wheelchair Curling National Bonspiel will take place in Blaine, Minn., on Aug. 20-23.

All wheelchair curling athletes that have demonstrated the ability to play regulation curling games are encouraged to register for this Bonspiel.

Athletes will register into the Bonspiel as individuals (no team entries). All teams will be developed using a draft system in which current members of the National High Performance Program will serve as skips and select their teams. This will provide for as equally matched teams as possible. There will be multiple events (number will be determined based on the number of entries) with all participants receiving an award.

All athletes are also eligible to register for the National Pre-Trials. Registration for the Pre-Trials is necessary if you wish to be evaluated to potentially qualify for the 2016 National Team. The National Pre-Trials registration form must be completed if you wish to compete in the Pre-Trials. The Bonspiel will serve two functions:

- 1. To increase wheelchair curling participation across the country.
- 2. To provide the National Selection Committee with an opportunity to evaluate all athletes registered in the 2015 National Wheelchair Curling Team Pre-Trials.

The Bonspiel entry fee is \$25 per individual

Practice ice is available on Thursday, Aug. 20, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Four Seasons Curling Club.

The deadline for registration is July 20, 2015.

Letter from the National Director

Paul Dahlke—National Director

PVA 69th Annual Convention

The 69th annual PVA convention was held in San Diego, California. Since its completion the PVA has a strong positive outlook for the future. Showing his commitment to the PVA and all veterans, VA Secretary Bob McDonald spent two days with us. He first went on a tour with PVA President AL Kovac and Deputy Executive Director Sherman Gillums to the San Diego, VA SCI center. Later he attended the welcome reception held on the USS Midway. The next day Mr. McDonald gave the board a presentation on the state of the VA and his plans for the future. Secretary McDonald's remarks included praise for the commitment and work of the PVA.

Mr. McDonald explained how the VA is a "three legged stool", as research, education and clinical care are the legs. Secretary McDonald states that the 1.8 billion dollars for over 2,200 projects is too little. He also states that the VA should have a great sense of pride for they have won many awards and that 70% of doctors and a vast majority of nurses are trained at the VA.

Currently there are roughly 9.1 million veterans enrolled in clinical care. however the VA's health care system's veterans are aging, with 9 million over 65 years old. The result is more claims with more issues per claim. Currently there are 8.5 to 19% of veterans receiving compensation due to these factors: ten years of war, Agent Orange, unlimited claims process, increased claims issues, higher survival rate, better ways to I.D. and treat and demographic shifts. These factors are affecting demand as well.

The VA's infrastructure needs much improvement, as well as 60% of the buildings are 50 years old, but the VA is short 7.9 million for construction. This has been the challenge that the VA is faced with now. Even so the VA has still managed to complete applications, 880,000 more authorizations, activated 93 buildings and hired over 38,000 employees. The VA has completed 71% reduction of its backlog, and has reduced veterans' homelessness by 33%. Mr. McDonald explained that this is "My VA" for all veterans, and has pledged to continue improve the veterans experience by achieving support service, establish a culture continuous performance improvement, and enlarge strategic partnerships and to improve employee experience by focusing on people and culture. The VA will now be divided into five separate regions: Pacific, Continental, Midwest, Southeast and North

Atlantic.

Congress continues to make cuts, which makes the process more challenging, and has recently made a 188 million dollar cut, resulting in 70,000 fewer veterans receiving care, and eliminates funds for construction and cemetery expansion, {Portland is effected by this}.

Many Awards are given out each year to outstanding members and supporters of the PVA, this year's winners include: The Cal-Diego chapter, Gateway, Arizona, Iowa, and Kentucky-Indiana. A new award was established: "the Gordon Mansfield Congressional Leadership Award". To be given annually to a member of

Congress who exhibits strong leadership and support of PVA's priorities in veterans' health care benefits and disability rights.

This year we will have the same executive committee with only one new member; Pat {Hack} Albertson from the Kentucky-Indiana chapter will be filling the vacant seat.

Those are the highlights from the convention, now the work of the national staff and executive committee and the chapters will continue so that our members will continue to receive the benefits they deserve. I urge you to get involved with the chapter, as we need your support.

Memories of Ann Margaret & USO Show

I missed Ann Margaret and Bob Hope—and every other USO show, with the exception of Martha Ray. I got to see her show from nearly a ¼ mile away.

I checked the following story about Ann Margaret. Snopes declared it to be "True". This is one of the rare stories I will pass on...

Ann Margaret...

This is a good counter-balance story to the Jane Fonda, "Vietnam Woman Of The Year," story.

Vietnam 1966

Richard, (my husband), never really talked a lot about his time in Vietnam, other than he had been shot by a sniper. However, he had a rather grainy, 8 x 10 black and white photo he had taken at a USO show of Ann Margret with Bob Hope in the background that was one of his treasures.

A few years ago, Ann Margaret was doing a book signing at a local bookstore. Richard wanted to see if he could get her to Sign the treasured photo so he arrived at the bookstore at 12 o'clock for the 7:30 signing.

When I got there after work, the line went all the way around the bookstore, circled the parking lot, and disappeared behind a parking garage. Before her appearance, bookstore employees announced that she would sign only her book and no memorabilia would be permitted.

Richard was disappointed, but wanted to show her the photo and let her know how much those shows meant to lonely GI's so far from home.. Ann Margaret came out looking as beautiful as ever and, as second in line, it was soon Richard's turn.

He presented the book for her signature

and then took out the photo. When he did, there were many shouts from the employees that she would not sign it. Richard said, "I understand. I just wanted her to see it."

She took one look at the photo, tears welled up in her eyes and she said, "This is one of my gentlemen from Vietnam and I most certainly will sign his photo. I know what these men did for their country and I always have time for 'my gentlemen."

With that, she pulled Richard across the table and planted a big kiss on him. She then made quite a to-do about the bravery of the young men she met over the years, how much she admired them, and how much she appreciated them. There weren't too many dry eyes among those close enough to hear. She then posed for pictures and acted as if he were the only one there.

That night was a turning point for him. He walked a little straighter and, for the first time in years, was proud to have been a Vet. I'll never forget Ann Margret for her graciousness and how much that small act of kindness meant to my husband.

Later at dinner, Richard was very quiet. When I asked if he'd like to talk about it, my big, strong husband broke down in tears.. "That's the first time anyone ever thanked me for my time in the Army," he said.

I now make it a point to say 'Thank you' to every person I come across who served in our Armed Forces. Freedom does not come cheap and I am grateful for all those who have served their country.

If you'd like to pass on this story, feel free to do so. Perhaps it will help others to become aware of how important it is to acknowledge the contribution our service people make.—Arthur unknown

VETERANS CHOICE PROGRAM



The Veterans Choice Program provides eligible Veterans the option to receive VA Community Care from approved providers in their communities.

Am I eligible?

Have you been told by your local VA medical facility that they can't schedule your appointment within 30 days of the clinically indicated date or if no such date can be determined, your preferred date?

Is your current residence more than 40 miles from the closest VA medical facility?

Do you need to travel by air, boat or ferry to the VA medical facility closest to your home?

Do you face an unusual or excessive burden in traveling to a VA medical facility based on the presence of a body of water or a geologic formation that cannot be crossed by road? If you were enrolled in VA
Health care on or before
Aug 1, 2014 or you are
eligible to enroll as a combat
Veteran, and answered

" YES "

to any of the questions, you may be eligible!

How do I set up an appointment?

Gather your information about any other health insurance coverage you may have (e.g., employer, union-based health plans)

Call 1-866-606-8198 to make sure you qualify + schedule an appointment.
When you call, we will walk you through the following steps:

- · You will be asked to enter your ZIP code, and first and last name.
- · We will check to make sure you are eligible for this program.
- We will check which of your needs are covered by the VA.
- You will be asked for your address and the name of your preferred VA Community
 Care. Unfortunately, not all providers will be eligible to participate so if your
 preferred provider is not available, we will recommend other providers in your area.

We will then work with you to schedule an appointment.

HE 4TH OF JULY

Have you ever wondered what happened to the 56 men who signed the Declaration of Independence?

Five signers were captured by the British as traitors and were tortured before they died.

Twelve had their homes ransacked and burned.

Two lost their sons serving in the Revolutionary Army; another had two sons captured.

Nine of the 56 fought and died from wounds or hardships of the Revolutionary War. They signed and they pledged their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor. What kind of men were they?

Twenty-four were lawyers and jurists.

Eleven were merchants, nine were farmers and large plantation owners; men of means, well educated, but they signed the Declaration of Independence knowing full well that the penalty would be death if they were captured.

Carter Braxton of Virginia, a wealthy planter and trader, saw his ships swept from the seas by the British Navy. He sold his home and properties to pay his debts, and died in rags.

Thomas McKeam was so hounded by the British that he was forced to move his family almost constantly. He served in the Congress without pay, and his family was kept in hiding. His possessions were taken from him, and poverty was his reward.

Vandals or soldiers looted the properties of Dillery, Hall, Clymer, Walton , Gwinnett, Heyward, Ruttledge, and Middleton.

At the battle of Yorktown, Thomas Nelson, Jr., noted that the British General Cornwallis had taken over the Nelson home for his headquarters. He quietly urged General George Washington to open fire. The home was destroyed, and Nelson died bankrupt.

Francis Lewis had his home and properties destroyed. The enemy jailed his wife, and she died within a few months.

John Hart was driven from his wife's bedside as she was dying. Their 13 children fled for their lives. His fields and his gristmill were laid to waste. For more than a year he lived in forests and caves, returning home to find his wife dead and his children vanished.

So, take a few minutes while enjoying your 4th of July holiday and silently thank these patriots. It's not much to ask for the price they paid.

Remember: freedom is never free!

It's time we get the word out that patriotism is NOT a sin, and the Fourth of July has more to it than beer, picnics, and baseball games.—Author Unknown


